### Third Saturday in the month 10:00 - 4:00

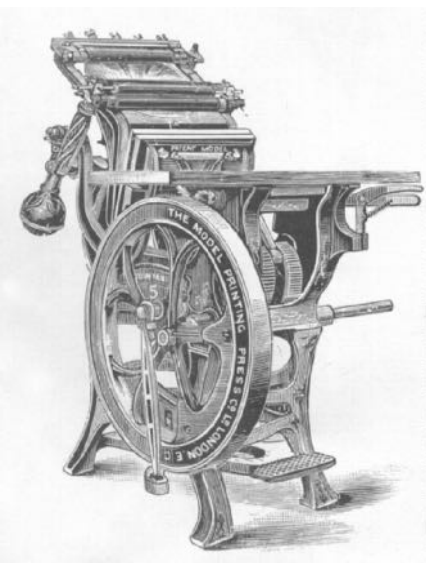

LETTERPRESS PRINTING PLATEN for restoration \$500

1877 MODEL number 5 Platen, 7x11 Chase size, 6x10 Image size. Hand fed, foot operated and small enough for home use.

Coming up to 140 years old now and has been saved and dry stored by me for 25 years. This machine weighs 270kg and will need only common sense to dismantle and restore. Very little missing, the treadle to flywheel connecting rod is one item I can see so possibly there will be some other little things too.

First patented in 1874 in USA, Carlo Giuseppe Squintani took out the British patent in 1877. C G Squintani & Co was a Printers Broker who sold complete printing outfits from its London showroom. A similar press, perhaps a number 6 is in Kelly Tarlton's Museum and is the actual press used for Shackleton's Expedition to Antarctica. If this was on the ship the Discovery it would have to be in 1907 rather than the 1915 voyage seeing as how the Endurance was crushed in the ice and lost.

If you miss this opportunity you may never find another press of this age and handy size again!
